

\$20 Dealer's Choice cash game with no wild cards

Dealer's Choice is a **format**, not one particular poker game: the dealer chooses the game, then the deal passes to the next player.

- **Buy-in:** \$20
- **Cards:** One standard 52-card deck
- **Wild cards:** None
- **Game changes:** Every hand
- **Dealer chooses:** The game before dealing
- **Betting:** Fixed limit rather than no-limit
- **Cash out:** Your chips represent your money; \$20 worth of chips = \$20

Dealer's Choice commonly allows the game to change every hand or every orbit; for a \$20 casual game, **changing every hand** keeps things interesting.

The most important rule

The dealer must announce the game before any cards are dealt.

How a hand works

Let's say there are **9 players**.

Hand #1

Player 1 is dealer.

He says:

"Texas Hold'em."

Play normal Hold'em.

When the hand is finished, the dealer button moves one position.

Hand #2

Player 2 is dealer.

He says:

"5-Card Draw."

Everybody now plays 5-Card Draw.

Hand #3

Player 3 says:

"7-Card Stud."

Everybody plays Stud.

And so on.

This is the basic idea of Dealer's Choice.

- **×** Jokers
